Overall Evaluation	<p>We continue to offer a strong programme for PE and sport throughout the school. The Sports grant enhances activities and improves outcomes for all groups of pupils. Much of our success stems from strong leadership of a dedicated PE co-ordinator. Specialist coaches have enhanced our provision, for example, hockey and gymnastics. A new scheme, REAL PE, was introduced in July 2016 and the success of this scheme is being monitored. New sports continue to be introduced as part of our after school club offer. Pupil participation in clubs has increased each year since the introduction of the grant. The school, with this financial support, enters over 10 sporting tournaments a year, giving a variety of children the opportunity to represent their school. Strong partnerships have been formed with a number of local sports providers. The introduction of our new running track ensures healthy and active lifestyles are encouraged in all of our children with an emphasis this year on active learning across the curriculum.</p>
